

- You can start the progestogen-only pill any time in your menstrual cycle if it is certain that you are not pregnant.
- 2 Take one tablet EVERY day
- Choose a convenient time to take your pill and take it at the SAME TIME every day.
- There are NO BREAKS between pill packs
- Your pill is IMMEDIATELY effective if started on the first day of your period.
- If you are advised to start it on any other day you need to use CONDOMS or AVOID SEX for the first 48 hours.
- There is a 12 HOUR WINDOW for each pill. For example, if you take your pill at 8am you have until 8pm to remember it.
- If your pill is more than 12 HOURS LATE or you are sick less than 2 hours after taking it, this is a MISSED PILL and your pill might not work.
- If this happens, take a pill immediately and then continue your normal routine. You must also use CONDOMS or AVOID SEX for 48 HOURS until the pill is fully active again.
- If you might have had 'unprotected sex' following missed pills, seek advice on whether EMERGENCY CONTRACEPTION is also required.
- SICKNESS, DIARRHOEA and SOME OTHER TABLETS can stop your pill working properly
